



## Chapter IV - Vital Statistics

### 1. Births, Deaths and Natural Increase

The data are based on personal details that appear in the Population Registry and the following Ministry of Interior forms: *Notification of Live Birth*, *Notification of Death* and *Notification of Stillbirth*.

Live birth - the birth of a fetus that shows at least one of the following signs of life: respiration, heartbeat, umbilical pulse or obvious movements of voluntary muscles.

Stillbirth - the birth of a fetus after a pregnancy of at least 22 weeks or weighing 500 grams and over that does not show any of the above signs of life.

Infant - a baby that has not yet completed one year of life.

Pre-mature – a baby weighing less than 1500 grams at birth.

Infant mortality - death of infants before their first birthday.

Natural increase - is defined as the balance of births and deaths.

Infant mortality rate - computed per 1,000 live births.

Crude birth rate - the number of live births per 1,000 persons.

Total fertility rate - the average number of children a woman is expected to bear during her lifetime. The rate is based on the assumption that child bearing among all the women of a certain generation will occur between the ages 15 and 49, according to the specific birth rates of the women in the population, in every age group.

### 2. Termination of Pregnancy

Termination of a pregnancy may be carried out according to the Penal Law - 1977, Termination of Pregnancy, as follows:

1. The woman is under marriageable age (17 years) or over 40 years.
2. The pregnancy is a result of relations prohibited by criminal law, incestuous relations or extramarital relations.
3. The infant is likely to have a physical or mental defect.
4. Continuation of the pregnancy is likely to endanger the woman's life or cause her physical or mental harm.



### 3. Marriages and Divorces

From 2008 the only data source on marriages and divorces is the Population Registry. In the past, the primary source of data was marriage and divorce certificates.
